
Time for some good news. A new version of Windows 7 is available to upgrade, and it comes with both Serbian language and Latinica interface by default. This means that the new system doesn't require any additional steps on your part to maintain Serbian language, although it can be switched off in Control Panel -> Display -> Languages (Show only English Language). The tricks of success are simple: you should be familiar with our site because we bring you daily Windows 7 updates; you should be well aware how much work Windows update really requires; and finally, you should make sure everything is ready before making this improvement. If everything is done properly, the procedure will take less than an hour and cost significantly less than a full installation. Before you start with Windows 7 upgrade, make sure that you have the following at hand: A DVD burner (or at least an empty DVD) Before receiving Windows 7 upgrade, make sure that your PC meets the system requirements. It's a free tool from Microsoft – just install and run it to check whether your PC is ready for Windows 7. Since this is a large file, we recommend that you download it first and then run it on your computer. You can also burn a copy of this file to a disc so that you have the offline version for future reference. A bootable disc (a CD, DVD, thumbdrive) Always keep an up-to-date installation media to use during the upgrade process. The Windows 7 installation disc (or the bootable disc that you made earlier) If your computer came with Windows 7, you'll already have this. If not, you may want to purchase one here . It's important that this CD is unlocked so that you can install it on any computer without a product key. If you don't have a Windows 7 disc, but your PC is reasonably new enough not to require an upgrade activation code, there are several other ways to get it. Microsoft makes this tool available free of charge . A computer with enough RAM to hold the temporary files during upgrade. For example, upgrading from Windows XP to Windows 7 requires at least 1 gigabyte of RAM. You will need more for upgraded versions of Windows 7.
